Government Affairs by Gus Dante (Federal Legislative & Government Affairs for National chapter) - UPDATE

Gus had two appointments on the hill Thursday May 25, 2017 before Memorial Day Weekend, with Rep Lance on H.R. 504 to discuss cosponsors for the bill. and also met with the AOC (Architect of The Capital) checking on the progress on the POW/MIA Chair placement in the emancipation Hall of the United States capital, First, Joe Muller and Gus met with the Architect Of the Capitol and staffers from Senator Warren's office and Representative Lynch's office to discuss the status of the POWMIA Chair. In that meeting Feras Sleiman from Sen, Warrens' office had said that the Senate Rules Committee who reviewed the wording on the plague "Dedicated by Rolling Thunder®, Inc. National" would have to be eliminated. Gus was very upset to say the least .Their reason was not to set a precedent due to the fact that all the statues in the statuary Hall have no "Dedicated By". The staffers emphatically said that any publication on the hill, and any media regarding the POW/MIA Remembrance Act/Chair of Honor Placed in the US Capitol before and after the DEDICATION will read that the POW/MIA Chair was "Dedicated By Rolling Thunder®, Inc. National". After returning from Rolling Thunder XXX Artie Muller and Gus had discussed the situation and conveyed to the AOC and Sen. Warren's office, how we at Rolling Thunder Inc. National were very disappointed about the decision, but we will accept the Senate Rules and the AOC policy, not to delay placement of the chair. After President Obama signed into law April 2016.

Date: June 7, 2017 at 6:06 PM Subject: RE: POW/MIA Chair Thanks Gus. We understand that this was a difficult decision. We informed the Rules Committee of your acceptance of their policy regarding the plague language, and we'll keep you updated on the progress of the chair. NOTE: From The AOC Sat 6/17/2017. We are moving forward and started the procurement process. My team will check in every few weeks to give me a status update so I'll do the same for you. Second, we met with Rep. Lance of NJ who is the sponsor of the legislation for H.R. 504: "To amend title 36, United States Code to require that the POW/MIA flag be Displayed on ALL DAYS that the flag of the United States is displayed." That morning Thursday May 25, 2017 Rep. Lance on the house floor congratulated Rolling Thunder Inc. for our 30th anniversary for promoting the POW/MIA issue not only in DC but also helping Veterans throughout the year. He also mentioned H.R/504 that the POW/MIA Flag should fly All DAYS the US Flag is displayed. Gus hand delivered to Rep. Lance's office over 2000 signatures from Winston Bailey, President RT-1 Ohio chapter, who started a petition to have the residents of Ohio sign in support of H.R. 504. Rolling Thunder Inc. Chapter 1 Ohio Great Job and Thank you.

To date there are only three co-sponsors to this bill—none from OHIO. I had the opportunity to speak to Congressman Jim Renacci from Ohio at the State Run. He had not heard of this legislation yet but said that he would look into it. His explanation was that it was only introduced in January of 2017, and it takes a long time for the bill to get to the floor of the House. Get those letters sent!

Bones found near wreckage of WWII-era US bomber in Croatia (From Stars and Stripes) By ASSOCIATED PRESSPublished: July 10, 2017

ZAGREB, Croatia— Divers have located human bones near the wreckage of a U.S. bomber that crashed in the Adriatic Sea in Croatia in 1944.

The discovery was made last week at the site of the crash of The Tulsamerican, the last B-24 Liberator bomber built in Tulsa, Oklahoma, near the end of World War II, according to Croatia's state TV.

"The remains of human bones have been found, but we can't say anything without further analysis," Zadar University archaeologist Mate Parica said.

The wreckage itself was found at the bottom of the sea at a depth of some 40 meters (130 feet) near the island of Vis in 2010 after a 17-year search. Three members of the 10-man crew were killed in the crash.

Tomo Medved, who heads Croatia's ministry for war veterans, said the U.S. is still looking for some 200 Americans who perished in Croatia during WWII. Croatia was run by a Nazi puppet regime during the war. Medved pledged the country's cooperation.

"We will launch the procedure to sign an agreement between our countries so that we would find the remains of some 200 people that the United States is searching for in the territory of the Republic of Croatia," he said.

An effort to recover and return pieces of the wreckage to Oklahoma for display at the Tulsa Air

and Space Museum has been underway for several years.

The plane was hit after a bombing run over Germanoccupied Poland. It crashed into the Adriatic Sea on Dec. 17, 1944. The crew apparently tried to get the plane back to its base in Italy, but they eventually decided to ditch it in the Adriatic.
