

As I go through the listof remains that have been identified, every now and then there are names on there of servicemen who were killed in the Battle of Tarawa in 1943 and wondered where that was. In a nutshell, here is the history.

The Battle of Tarawa was a battle in the Pacific Theater of World War II that was fought from November 20 to November 23, 1943. It took place at the Tarawa Atoll in the Gilbert Islands. Nearly 6,400 Japanese, Koreans, and Americans died in the fighting, mostly on and around the small island of Betio, in the extreme southwest of Tarawa Atoll.

The Battle of Tarawa was the first American offensive in the critical central Pacific region. It was also the first time in the Pacific War that the United States faced serious Japanese opposition to an amphibious landing. Previous landings had met little or no initial resistance, but on Tarawa the 4,500 Japanese defenders were well-supplied and well-prepared, and they fought almost to the last man, exacting a heavy toll on the United States Marine Corps. The U.S. had suffered similar casualties throughout the duration of other previous campaigns, for example over the six months of the Guadalcanal Campaign, but the losses on Tarawa were incurred within the space of 76 hours.

The Gilbert Islands are part of Micronesia. They became a colony of the British Empire in January 1916. They were invaded and occupied by the Empire of Japan in December 1941. The battle was fought almost two years later. In July 1979 the islands became independent from the United Kingdom and now comprise part of the nation of Kiribati.

More than 1,000 U.S. troops were killed in action and some 2,000 were wounded in only three days of fighting at Tarawa.

So now we know.

Government Affairs by Gus Dante (Federal Legislative & Government Affairs for National chapter)

The 115th Congress has begun January 3, 2017. All legislation that was introduced in the 114th congress will have to be reintroduced with ALL new bill numbers. Gus contacted Rep. Leonard Lance's (R-NJ 7) office on reintroducing H.R. 4910. This is now H.R. 504. The Bill reads as follows: "To Amend Title 36 US Code to require that the POW/MIA Flag to be displayed ALL DAYS that the US Flag is Displayed, especially over the US White House and the US Capitol."

Gus is working on a companion bill in the Senate and has contacted New Jersey Senator Cory Booker's office in which he spoke to Michael Songer, a Military Advisor who will work with Rep. Lance's office. ALL Chapters of Rolling Thunder®, Inc. throughout the country will be notified to help make this legislation Law. We must continue to pressure our representatives to promote and pass legislation that pertains to the POW/MIA and Veteran related issues.

Gus is also working with the AOC (Architect of the Capitol) on the placement of the POW/MIA Chair of Honor Memorial. The manufacturing and cost of the plaque is the only obstacle and this obstacle is expected to be resolved soon.

Remember: <u>You</u> are the voice of our POW and MIAs.

Contacting Representatives by phone
Hello, my name is, and I'm calling today from Rolling Thunder®Inc. Chapter 1 Ohio I would like to speak with the Staffer who handles Military/Veterans Affairs.
Make sure you make clear why you are calling: If you make contact with the MA (Military Affairs) staffer, tell them you would like for their boss Congressman/woman to cosponsor: H.R. 504- To amend title 36, US Code, to require that the POW/MIA flag be displayed on ALL
DAYS that the flag of the United States is displayed.

If you don't make contact, leave Voice Mail message Why you are calling and have them call you back.

More than likely they will want you to email them, but leave Voice Mail and also email them. Get the spelling of the MA. House emails are usually. john.doe@mail.house.gov

After your email, and speaking with the MA, give them about a week. If you don't hear back from them, then call back to see if they are going to cosponsor H.R. 504.

H.R. 299/ 5. 422: Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2017.

THE 2017 Summit Racing Piston Powered AutoRama took place at the Cleveland IX Center March 17-19. Totaling over 1,000,000 square feet [think 21 football fields] of display area, every type of machine that moved with a piston powered motor was represented. Acres of airplanes, classic cars, custom cars, antique vehicles, vintage motorcycles, custom motorcycles, boats, farm equipment and military vehicles were represented in large numbers. Added to all this activity were vendors representing everything from custom pin stripping to swap meet parts to die cast car collectors.

This year's show also recognized and celebrated a home-coming to over 67,000 Ohio female veterans.

Rolling Thunder Chapter's 1, 2 and 8 joined forces and occupied a large display area. The three-day paid attendance of 46,102 were generous in their support

of each Chapter's revenue collection activities which support their individual veteran's projects annually. Chapter 1 also took advantage of the event to interact with the passing crowd to explain House Bill 504; why we feel the POW/MIA flag should always fly in conjunction with the American flag at all government facilities all the time; where this bill is in the legislative process; and to generate additional support by signing our petition sheets asking that this bill be passed by congress. 1,235 signatures representing over 65 petition sheets were collected in support. These sheets will be delivered to our local congressmen.

The winners of the flag poles and flags that were raffled off were Leon from Ashtabula (who donated them back to the chapter, and Dennis from Akron.



Have you ever noticed the honor guard pays meticulous attention to correctly folding the United States of America Flag 13 times? You probably thought it was to symbolize the original 13 colonies, but we learn something new every day!


The 1st fold of the flag is a symbol of life.



The 2nd fold is a symbol of the belief in eternal life.



The 3rd fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veterans departing the ranks who gave a portion of their lives for the defense of the country to attain peace throughout the world.



The 4th fold represents the weaker nature, for as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace as well as in time of war for His divine guidance.



The 5th fold is a tribute to the country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, 'Our Country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right; but it is still our country, right or wrong.'



The 6th fold is for where people's hearts lie. It is with their heart that they pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States Of America, and the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.

The 7th fold is a tribute to its Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that they protect their country and their flag against all her enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of their republic.



The 8th fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day.



The 9th fold is a tribute to womanhood, and Mothers. For it has been through their faith, their love, loyalty and devotion that the character of the men and women who have made this country great has been molded. The 10th fold is a tribute to the father, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of their country since they were first born.



The 11th fold represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies in the Hebrews eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.



The 12th fold represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in the Christians eyes, God the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit.

The 13th fold, or when the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost reminding them of their nations motto, 'In God We Trust.'



After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under General George Washington, and the Sailors and Marines who served under Captain John Paul Jones, who were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States, preserving for them the rights, privileges and freedoms they enjoy today.

There are some traditions and ways of doing things that have deep meaning.

In the future, you'll see flags folded and now you will know why.
