





Congress to Honor American POW/MIA with Commemorative Chair

WASHINGTON—On Wednesday, November 8, leaders of the U.S. House and Senate will dedicated a commemorative chair in honor of American prisoners of war (POW) and the nearly 83,000 servicemen and women missing in action (MIA).

House Speaker Paul Ryan (R-WI), Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY), and House Democratic Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) took part in the bipartisan, bicameral ceremony. The ceremony was open to credentialed media, members of Congress, and invited guests only.

Commemorative chairs have been unveiled throughout the country to serve as a reminder of America's servicemen and women held prisoner or missing in action. In accordance with Public Law 114-147, the National POW/MIA Remembrance Act, the chair has been placed in Emancipation Hall of the United States Capitol Visitor Center.

Regarding the Bill to place the POW Flag at the White House and Capitol we do not have the necessary co-sponsors as of yet. The resistance of some to the new Trump administration prevents work being done. Gus remarked that the best way to contact your elected representative is email and phone as letters get delayed in processing.

To take action: Go to http://www.govtrack.us/. Search and review a bill or bills of interest, go to the website listed for your US Representatives or US Senators and send letters, e-mails and or faxes requesting an action (preferably in writing) to be taken such as to cosponsor the bill or support getting the bill/resolution to the floor for a vote. Or, call their DC office and ask to speak to their Military or Veteran Affairs staffer and request that an action be taken.

Remember: <u>You</u> are the voice of our POW and MIAs.

H.R.504 - To amend title 36, United States Code, to require that the POW/MIA flag be displayed on all days that the flag of the United States is displayed on certain Federal property.

To date there are still only three co-sponsors to this bill—none from OHIO.


H. Res. 219- Rep. Walker R-NC-6: Establishing a Select Committee on POW/MIA Affairs.

Are you patriotic or are you a Patriot?

By the time you read this article, 9-11 will have passed. Monday, the 11th of September is also known as Patriots Day. Some thoughts came across my mind as I pondered the events of that fateful day and the years since. Mainly, what it means to be a Patriot versus being a patriotic person?

Both of them can love their country. Both of them can bear the colors. Both of them can go to parades and wave the American flag. "But it is the Patriot that is willing to shed their blood, sweat and tears for the country they love." Patriotic people talk... but the real patriots are the ones that put their words into ACTION! Selfiessly working under the most horrific of conditions; bleeding, crying and willing to give the ultimate sacrifice to protect you, me, and their fellow person in battle. John 15:12-13 This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you. Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.

At last count, there has been well over 6,000 U.S. Military that have died in the War On Terror, these are TRUE patriots! On September 11th 2001 when Islamic Jihadists flew planes into the Twin Towers in New York and elsewhere, 2,977 people were murdered by terrorists. Some of those that died that day were true patriots, such as those on Flight 93 or the First Responders, some were patriotic Americans, and others were ar from either and were seeking to destroy this great nation. and the freedom we enjoy.
