Report submitted by Gus Dante Part (1) ASKING FOR COSPONSORS: H.R.504 - To amend title 36, United States Code, to require that the POW/MIA flag be displayed on all days that the flag of the United States is displayed on certain Federal property. With 7 cosponsors and a few more to be added at the end of the month I urge all Rolling Thunder Inc. Chapters Presidents and other veteran organizations to have their members call, email, or visit members of Congress while they are in their district offices or the DC offices. Ask them to cosponsor this bill H.R. 504. This is a bipartisan issue. No CBO (Congressional Budget Office) involved. Both the POW/MIA Chair of Honor that Rolling Thunder Inc. National placed in the Emancipation Hall on Nov. 8, 2017 in the U.S. Capital, and the POW/MIA flag flying on ALL DAYS that the American flag is displayed, will be a reminder to the families of our missing and to the public that our government has not forgotten those that did not come home. I understand that getting a hold of your Members of Congress (MOC), communicating with your MOC's is not only challenging and difficult at times, but we must continue to "press" forward by doing our part to keep our concerns/issues on the "doorstep" of our MOC's as well as continue to seek support with getting the Bills/Legislation we support to the "floor" for a vote! This is very important for our American POW/MIA's, Veterans' and our organization! Please keep in mind that these Bills/Legislation will "die" at the conclusion of the 115th Congress which will cause these Bills/Legislation to have to be reintroduced during the 116th Congress! Please continue to make contact with your MOC's by visiting their offices and writing letter requesting for the support (if they are not already a cosponsor), or request they request that the Bills/Legislation are taken to the "floor" for a vote! If you need "sample" letters or information in reference to Bills/Legislation, please send me an email and I will help you and or send you information and or help you the best I can! Might I suggest that you contact and or send letters to Representative Paul Ryan, Speaker of the House, Senator Mitch McConnell, Majority Leader as well as members (preferable Ranking, Majority and Minority Leaders) whom "sit" on a Committee where Bills/Legislation current "sit" stagnate! Please continue to follow the Bills/Legislation that we currently support and check for any updates.

We are continuing to "push" the following pieces of legislation:

- H. Res. 129 (120 co-sponsors)/S. Res. 61 (8 co-sponsors) Calling on the Department of Defense, other elements of the Federal Government, and foreign governments to intensify efforts to investigate, recover, and identify all missing and unaccounted-for personnel of the United States.
- H. Res. 219 (8 co-sponsors) Establishing a Select Committee on POW and MIA Affairs.
- H. R. 299 (328 co-sponsors)/S. 422 (49 co-sponsors) Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2017
- H. R. 504 To amend title 36, United States Code. to require that the POW/MIA flag be displayed on all days that the flag of the United States is displayed on certain Federal property. NOTE: For information in reference to these and other POW/MIA and Veterans' legislation as well as current cosponsors and bill status, committee assignments, etc. please visit https://www.congress.gov https://www.govtrack.us/accounts/login/?next=/acco unts/lists These websites are very good resources extremely user-friendly. To take action: Go to http://www.govtrack.us/. Search and review a bill or bills of interest, go to the website listed for your U5 Representatives or U5 Senators and send letters, e-mails and or faxes requesting an action (preferably in writing) to be taken such as to cosponsor the bill or support getting the bill/resolution to the floor for a vote. Or, call their DC office and ask to speak to their Military or Veteran Affairs staffer and request that an action be taken.

Remember: <u>You</u> are the voice of our POW and MIAs.

H.R.504 - To amend title 36, United States Code, to require that the POW/MIA flag be displayed on all days that the flag of the United States is displayed on certain Federal property.

To date there are only EIGHT co-sponsors to this bill—none from OHIO.



ARMED FORCES DAY - Saturday, May 19, 2018

President Harry S. Truman led the effort to establish a single holiday for citizens to come together and thank our military members for their patriotic service in support of our country.

On August 31, 1949, Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced the creation of an Armed Forces Day to replace separate Army, Navy, Marine Corps and Air Force Days. The single day celebration stemmed from the unification of the Armed Forces under the Department of Defense.



National Military Appreciation Month 2018

Declared by Congress in 1999, National Military Appreciation Month (NMAM) is celebrated every May and is a declaration that encourages U.S. citizens to observe the month in a symbol of unity. NMAM honors the current and former members of the U.S. Armed Forces, including those who have died in the pursuit of freedom. The month of May is characterized by six national observances which highlight the contributions of those who have served.

Public Service Recognition Week (PSRW)

Date: Sunday, May 6th - Saturday, May 12th, 2018. Celebrated the first full week in May.

About: A time set aside to honor the men and women who serve our nation as federal, state, county and local government employees and ensure that our government is the best in the world.

Victory in Europe Day AKA V-E Day or VE Day Date: Tuesday, May 8th, 2018

About: May 8th, 1945 is the day when Germans throughout Europe unconditionally surrendered to the Allies. This day marked the end of World War II in Europe

Military Spouse Appreciation Day

Date: Friday, May 11th, 2018. Traditionally set for the

Friday before Mother's Day.

About: A day to honor military spouses with appropriate ceremonies and activities. Recognizes the important role our military families play in keeping our Armed Forces strong and our country safe.

Armed Forces Day

Date: Saturday, May 19th, 2018. Celebrated the third Saturday in May every year.

About: A single holiday for citizens to come together and thank our military members for their patriotic service in support of our country. This day honors everyone serving in the U.S. Military branches; Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, Navy. There is also Armed Forces Week which typically leads up to Armed Forces Day, although it is not an official observance, many activities are planned nonetheless during the week.

Memorial Day

Date: Monday, May 28th, 2018. A Federal holiday observed on the last Monday in May.
About: A remembrance of our veterans.
Commemorates the men and women who died while in military service

Fly your flags (the correct way)

As Memorial Day approaches, it is certain that you will start to see more motorcycles out and about all over the country.

In case you are preparing to ride for Memorial Day and you're getting your bike flags unfurled, here is some info on the correct way to display your flags. "When the US flag is flown alone, it needs to be at the center on the back of the motorcycle, or to its "marching right." The "marching right" is on the right side of the motorcycle to the rider's perspective when facing forward. If the US Flag is on your bike with another, it should be to its "marching right." All flags flown with the US Flag are the same size and at the same height of the US Flag. While the US Flag is on your bike with several other flags the US flag is placed at the center and highest. Other flags should be arranged in alphabetical order and in decreasing importance - Nations first, states (in order of admittance) and territories second, military third (in order of establishment), and then any others."


