H.R. 2819/S 1673- Gold Star Families National Extension Act of 2019. We are adding two bills to the Government Affairs Web. H.R-2819/S-1673-Gold Star Families National Extension Act of 2019; sponsored by Congressman Andy Kim (D-NJ) in the House, and sponsored by Senator Booker (DNJ) in the Senate. The Gold star families have been waiting for 9 plus years to get this monument placed at Arlington National Cemetery where it should be. The Gold Star Families have faced many obstacles for getting this monument completed. The funding for the monument will end 2020. This legislation will extend funding to 2027.

Gold Star Family Members Can Now Become Congressional Fellows

To give members of families of the fallen firsthand experience in Congress, lawmakers approved a yearlong fellowship for them Tuesday.

"It will allow Gold Star Families to both participate in and learn about the democracy their loved one gave the ultimate sacrifice to protect," said Rep. Zoe Lofgren, D-California, while introducing the resolution on the floor.

Passed by voice vote, the paid fellowship is named in memory of <u>Army</u> Sgt. 1st Class Sean Cooley and Spc. Christopher Horton. The fellowship will be open to children, stepchildren, <u>spouses</u> and siblings of service members who died while serving for any reason other than "willful misconduct" and the families of those who died from a service-connected disability within four years of leaving service. The fellowship will be in Washington, D.C., or in the district office of a representative or delegate in the House.

Horton's widow, Jane, said the program will help Gold Star families "give purpose to pain" and have a "living legacy" close to representatives, reminding them of what their votes mean. Only 15 percent of Congress has served in the military.

"You can walk into almost any members' offices and there'll be a sign that says, 'We hire heroes," Horton said. "And there's never been anything like that to include Gold Star families or the families left behind in war."

Horton worked with Rep. Trent Kelly, R-Mississippi, to create the program, which she said will probably take a few months to set up.

It will mirror Congress' current wounded warrior program.

"It's a beautiful thing, you know, of the people, by the people and for the people," Horton said. "I really feel that this bill is the epitome of that process. It's something I was passionate about. I met a member of Congress who cared, and so we worked on the bill together, and here it is."

After watching from the House balcony with other Gold Star families as the resolution passed, she posted on Facebook, "Today was a humbling day -- and one that reminds us that in America -- the land of the free, and home of the brave, anything can be done if you don't give up."

Cooley, 35, a member of the Mississippi Army <u>National Guard</u>'s 150th Combat Engineer Battalion, died in 2005 during Operation Iraqi Freedom when an improvised explosive device detonated near his vehicle.

Horton, 26, died in 2011 during Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan. He was attached to the 45th Infantry Brigade Combat Team of Oklahoma National Guard and is buried in Arlington National Cemetery.

"Nothing can ever fill the void left by the loss of a loved one who was killed serving the nation," Lofgren said. "But we in Congress should be doing everything we can to help lift up those who have suffered that unfathomable loss."

Our Blessings, His Love

To him who led his people through the wilderness; His love endures forever.


Psalm 136:16

In 2015, a woman discarded her deceased husband's computer at a recycling center—a computer that had been made in 1976. But more important than when it had been made was who made it. It was one of 200 computers hand built by Apple founder Steve Jobs, and was worth an estimated quarter of a million dollars! Sometimes knowing the true worth of something means knowing who made it.

Knowing that it's God who made us shows us how valuable we are to Him (Genesis 1:27). Psalm 136 catalogs key moments of His people—ancient Israel: how they had been freed from captivity in Egypt (vv. 11-12), journeyed through the wilderness (v. 16), and were given a new home in Canaan (vv. 21-22). But each time a moment of Israel's history is mentioned, it's paired with this repeated refrain: "His love endures forever." This refrain reminded the people of Israel that their experiences weren't random historical events. Each moment had been orchestrated by God and was a reflection of His enduring love for those He'd made.

Far too often, I allow moments that show God at work and His kind ways to simply pass by, failing to recognize that every perfect gift comes from my heavenly Father (James 1:17) who made me and loves me. May you and I learn to connect every blessing in our lives to God's enduring love for us.
