Actually, he spoke to Joe Bean who sent Matt (Chico) to get me at the Staten Island event. He let me know about, some of the legislation that Mr. Van Drew was working on. These are some of the bills That Mr. Van Drew is working on that we are supporting:

HR 1476 - PFC Joseph P. Dwyer Peer Support
Program Act - This bill requires the Department of
Veterans Affairs (VA) to establish the PFC Joseph P.
Dwyer Peer Support Program to make grants to
eligible entities for peer-to-peer mental health
programs for veterans. — 04/27/2021
Referred to the Subcommittee on health.
Action by: Committee on Veterans" Affairs

HR 1656 - TREAT PTSD Act - This bill requires the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and the Department of Defense (DOD) to furnish stellate ganglion block to certain veterans or members of the Armed Forces (including reserve components) diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Blocking the stellate ganglion (a group of nerves at the base of the neck) by injecting a local anesthetic is a treatment that may alleviate PTSD symptoms. - 03/08/2021 Referred to the Committee on Armed Services and, in addition to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

HR 1022 - PAWS Act of 2021 - This bill requires the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to implement a grant program for the purpose of pairing service dogs with eligible veterans. Organizations that receive grants must provide veterinary health insurance coverage, hardware, and travel expenses for each service dog and veteran participating in the program. — 03/22/2021 Referred to the Sub-committee on Health

HR 1448 - Puppies Assisting Wounded Servicemembers for Veterans Therapy Act - This bill implements a program and a policy related to service dog therapy for veterans. Specifically, the bill requires the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to implement a five-year pilot program to provide canine training to eligible veterans diagnosed with posttraumatic stress disorder as an element of a complementary and integrative health program. Eligible veterans are those who are enrolled in the VA health care system and have been recommended for participation by a qualified mental health care provider or clinical team. - H.R. 1448 Puppies Assisting Wounded Servicemembers for Veterans Therapy Act was signed into law By President Joe Biden August 25, 2021. 08/25/2021 Became Public Law No: 117-37

HR 1123 - Veteran Suicide Prevention Act - This bill requires the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to complete a review of the deaths of all covered veterans who died by suicide during the five-year period preceding the enactment of this bill. Covered veterans are those who received VA hospital care or medical services during the five-year period preceding the death of the veteran. I have sent a letter of support to Congressman Van Drew. I also sent a letter of support to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, the Honorable Denis R. McDonough to thank him for pushing through the presumptive Disability Benefits Status covering asthma, rhinitis, and sinusitis. Adding that hopefully they can work to get the other presumptive disabilities added. 03/22/2021 Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.

New law gives veterans, Gold Star Families free lifetime access to America's national parks

A new law is giving veterans and Gold Star Families free lifetime access to national parks and federal recreational lands. The <u>Alexander Lofgren</u> <u>Veterans in Parks (VIP) Act</u> was rolled into the <u>National Defense Authorization Act</u>, which was <u>signed into law</u> over the holidays.

"When you take your oath, if you go into the service, to protect and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic, you really are protecting the homeland," the National Park Service's new director and Navy veteran Chuck Sams told USA TODAY. "I think this is a great recognition of that responsibility you took on to serve your nation."

In 2020, the National Park Service announced that veterans and Gold Star Families, who've lost loved ones in the line of service to this country, would receive <u>free access</u> to the park service's 423 sites around the country. This new law makes the move permanent and also cements the <u>free annual passes</u> available for active-duty military.

"Our legislation - named after <u>Arizona veteran</u> <u>Alexander Lofgren</u> - represents a small thanks for our military community's brave service and promotes access to our beautiful national parks," the bill's lead sponsor in the Senate, Sen. Kyrsten Sinema, D-Ariz, said in a statement.

Lofgren, a congressional aide for Rep. Raúl Grijalva, D-Ariz, and former volunteer for Sinema, died at Death Valley National Park last April.

Before joining Grijalva's office as a Wounded War Fellow in 2019, he served four years in the Army as a combat engineer and deployed to Afghanistan in 2011, according to the <u>announcement of his hiring</u>.

Grijalva said Lofgren loved the outdoors and used it as therapy.

"Alex working with us here saw that nature, our open spaces, our state and federal park lands and wilderness areas and public places were therapeutic, that they were important in the reintegrations of veterans back into our civilian life here after they completed their service to the nation, and he was a huge proponent of that," Grijalva told The Arizona Republic, part of the USA TODAY Network.

"As a veteran, I know firsthand the importance of national parks as a place of connection and healing when dealing with the visible and invisible wounds of war," Rep. Ruben Gallego, D-Ariz., said in a statement.

He and fellow veteran Rep. Mariannette Miller-Meeks, R-Iowa, introduced <u>the bill</u> in the House last summer.

Following the law's signing, Miller-Meeks, a doctor who served 24 years in the Army, said in a statement, "We often say that we support the

physical and mental health of our veterans, and it is great to see legislation pass that will do great things for the health of our heroes."
